The project manager Martina Korsah a JSS graduate mobilised the uniforms, bags and used clothing from her school

Mr. Nyarko a teacher at the Laterbiokorshie 4 JSS also played a key role in helping to spread the information around and personally saw to it that the students contributed their quota to the project.
